\$564.1 MILLION *POWERBALL*[®] JACKPOT WINNING TICKET SOLD IN TEXAS

(AUSTIN) – A winning ticket for Wednesday night’s \$564.1 million *Powerball*[®] jackpot was sold in Texas at the Appletree Food Mart located at 893 E. Princeton in Princeton. The lucky Texan will split the prize with jackpot winners in North Carolina and Puerto Rico.

The numbers on the winning ticket were player selected and not a Quick Pick. The ticket matched all five numbers, 11-13-25-39-54 and the *Powerball*, 19. The winner selected the cash value option at the time of purchase.

“We are thrilled to have a winning ticket in Texas for this historic *Powerball* jackpot,” said Gary Grief, executive director of the Texas Lottery[®]. “If you have the winning ticket, sign the back of the ticket, put it in a safe place, and contact us as soon as possible.”

This is the second *Powerball* jackpot winner in Texas. Texas joined the multistate *Powerball* game in 2010 and had its first *Powerball* jackpot winner in 2013 when Paul McDowell of Ravenna claimed the \$40 million jackpot from the May 29, 2013 drawing.

In addition to last night’s jackpot winning ticket, three second-tier prize winning tickets of \$1 million were also sold in Fort Worth, Houston and Euless. Since January 2014, Texas has had 24 *Powerball* second-tier prize winners of \$1 million or \$2 million. Second-tier *Powerball* prizes are won by matching five numbers but not the *Powerball* number.

Last night's jackpot started as a \$40 million prize on Dec. 3, 2014 and is the result of 20 drawings with no jackpot winner. This is the fifth largest jackpot of any U.S. lottery game on record.

Powerball is played by choosing five numbers from one to 59 and one *Powerball* number from one to 35. Players win the jackpot by matching all five of the white ball numbers drawn and the red *Powerball* number. For \$1 more per play, the *Power Play*® feature is added and the non-jackpot prize winnings increase. *Powerball* drawings occur every Wednesday and Saturday at 9:59 p.m. CT.

Powerball overall odds are 1:31.8. All non-grand/jackpot prizes are guaranteed prizes. If funds are insufficient to pay guaranteed prizes, non-grand/jackpot prizes may be paid on a pari-mutuel basis and could be lower than the amounts shown. Power Play prizes shall be reduced if non-grand/jackpot prizes are paid on a pari-mutuel basis.
*The grand/jackpot prize is pari-mutuel and will be divided equally by the number of grand/jackpot prize winners.
**A Power Play Match Five (5+0) prize is set at \$2,000,000 regardless of the Power Play number selected. All other non-jackpot prizes will be multiplied by the Power Play number selected.
