SAN ANTONIO RESIDENT CLAIMS \$1 MILLION *POWERBALL*[®] PRIZE

(AUSTIN) – San Antonio resident Arnold E. Bowie claimed a second-tier *Powerball*[®] prize worth \$1 million. The ticket was purchased at Kirby Food Mart located at 5567 Old Seguin Road, Ste. #1 in Kirby for the Aug. 29 drawing.

Bowie's ticket matched all five of the white ball numbers drawn (18-21-25-28-29), but not the red *Powerball* number (16).

The claimant requested minimal publicity.

Powerball jackpots start at \$40 million and roll until the jackpot is won. Players win the jackpot by matching the five white ball numbers (1-59) and the red *Powerball* number (1-35). There are eight other ways to win non-jackpot prizes ranging from \$4 to \$1 million or up to \$2 million if the ticket includes *Power Play*. The overall odds of winning a prize in the game are approximately one in 31. The overall odds of winning the jackpot prize are one in 175,223,510.
