## **BEDFORD RESIDENT CLAIMS \$1 MILLION SCRATCH TICKET PRIZE**

---

(AUSTIN) – Jeffrey M. Tucker of Bedford claimed a prize worth \$1 million in the Texas Lottery® scratch ticket game [\\$500,000,000 Extreme Cash Blast](#). For selling the winning ticket, Brownie's located at 501 Bedford Road in Bedford is eligible for a \$10,000 retailer bonus.

Tucker claimed the 20th of 40 prizes worth \$1 million available in the game. Six top prizes worth \$2.5 million also remain unclaimed in the game. The claimant requested minimal publicity.

\$500,000,000 Extreme Cash Blast offers more than \$513.1 million in total prizes. Overall odds of winning any prize in \$500,000,000 Extreme Cash Blast are one in 2.84, including break-even prizes.

### About the Texas Lottery
