SPRINGTOWN RESIDENT CLAIMS \$1 MILLION POWERBALL® PRIZE

Winning ticket was sold in Decatur

(AUSTIN) – Jordan L. Crittenden of Springtown claimed a second-tier [Powerball®](#) prize worth \$1 million for the drawing held Jan. 13. Crittenden missed winning the world record \$1.5 billion jackpot by one number. Crittenden’s Quick Pick matched all five of the white ball numbers drawn (4-8-19-27-34), but not the red Powerball (10).

The ticket was purchased at the Horizon #1 located at 104 N. Highway 287 in Decatur. The claimant requested minimal publicity.

In addition to Crittenden’s ticket, a ticket worth \$2 million was sold in Houston and two other tickets each worth \$1 million were sold in Olmos Park and Dallas for the historic Jan. 13 drawing. The world record Powerball jackpot started at \$40 million on Nov. 7, 2015, and was the result of 19 drawings with no winner. The \$1.5 billion jackpot, with an estimated cash value of \$983.5 million, was won by winners in Florida, Tennessee and California.

Powerball jackpots start at \$40 million and roll until the jackpot is won. Players win the jackpot by matching five numbers from a field of 69 numbers and one Powerball number from a field of 26 numbers. Drawings are held each Wednesday and Saturday at 9:59 p.m. CT.
