## HOUSTON RESIDENT CLAIMS \$1 MILLION POWERBALL® PRIZE

---

(AUSTIN) – Delmer Zuniga Pacheco, of Houston, claimed a second-tier [Powerball®](#) prize worth \$1 million for the drawing held Sept. 28, 2016. The ticket was purchased at Super K Food Store, located at 611 Washington Ave. in Houston.

Pacheco's ticket matched five of the white ball numbers drawn (30-38-52-53-62), but not the red Powerball (1).

The claimant requested minimal publicity.

Powerball jackpots start at \$40 million and roll until the jackpot is won. Players win the jackpot by matching five numbers from a field of 69 numbers and one Powerball number from a field of 26 numbers. Drawings occur each Wednesday and Saturday at 9:59 p.m. CT.
