FORT WORTH RESIDENT CLAIMS \$7.5 MILLION SCRATCH TICKET PRIZE

(AUSTIN) – Tony Huynh, of Fort Worth, claimed a \$7.5 million prize in the Texas Lottery® scratch ticket game [\\$7,500,000 Ultimate Cash](#). For selling the winning ticket, Jimmy’s Food Store, located at 1316 Sycamore School Road in Fort Worth, is eligible for a \$10,000 retailer bonus.

The claimant requested minimal publicity.

Huynh claimed the second of three top prizes worth \$7.5 million available in the game. \$7,500,000 Ultimate Cash offers more than \$142 million in total prizes. Overall odds of winning any prize in the game are one in 2.52, including break-even prizes.

About the Texas Lottery

Beginning with the first ticket sold in 1992, the Texas Lottery has generated \$25 billion in revenue for the state and distributed \$50 billion in prizes to lottery players.
