HOUSTON RESIDENT CLAIMS \$1 MILLION SCRATCH TICKET PRIZE

(AUSTIN) – Jared Hemond, of Houston, claimed a \$1 million prize in the Texas Lottery® scratch ticket game [\\$1,000,000 High Roller](#). For selling the winning ticket, Walmart, located at 11755 Beechnut St. in Houston, is eligible for a \$10,000 retailer bonus.

The claimant requested minimal publicity.

Hemond claimed the second of three top prizes worth \$1 million available in the game. \$1,000,000 High Roller offers more than \$42.7 million in total prizes. Overall odds of winning any prize in the game are one in 6.38.
