## **KILGORE RESIDENT CLAIMS \$1 MILLION POWERBALL® PRIZE**

---

(AUSTIN) – A Kilgore resident claimed a [Powerball® prize worth \\$1,000,004 for the drawing on Aug. 15](#). The ticket was purchased at Food & Fuel Stop, located at 3212 Stone Road in Kilgore. The claimant elected to remain anonymous.

The second-tier winning ticket matched all five of the white ball numbers drawn (12-15-28-47-48), but not the red Powerball number (16). The claimant had an additional win of \$4 on the same ticket.

Powerball jackpots start at \$40 million and roll until the jackpot is won. Players win the jackpot by matching five numbers from a field of 69 numbers and one Powerball number from a field of 26 numbers. Drawings occur each Wednesday and Saturday at 10:12 p.m. CT.
