**UNCLAIMED \$1 MILLION POWERBALL® TICKET EXPIRES SEPT. 2**  
**Winning ticket was purchased in Addison**

(AUSTIN) – A \$1 million Powerball® ticket will expire on Sept. 2. A Quick Pick ticket matching five numbers drawn for [the March 6, 2019 drawing](#) was purchased at AAC #101, located at 5012 Belt Line Road, in Addison, but the \$1 million prize has not been claimed. As the Texas Lottery® [offices](#) are scheduled to be closed on Sept. 2 in observance of Labor Day, the prize must be claimed in person at a Texas Lottery Claim Center by Friday, Aug. 30, at 5 p.m. If claimed by mail, the ticket must be postmarked on or prior to the Monday, Sept. 2 expiration date.

The winning ticket matched all five of the white ball numbers drawn (6-10-21-35-46), but not the Powerball number (23).

“We encourage our Powerball players to take another look at their ticket, check the numbers again and if your numbers match, sign the back of the ticket and contact us,” said Gary Grief, executive director of the Texas Lottery.

A ticket holder forfeits any claim to a prize for a draw game after the expiration of the 180<sup>th</sup> day following the draw date. The deadline may be extended for a period of time for certain "eligible" military personnel. Unclaimed prizes revert back to the state for programs authorized by the Texas Legislature.

Beginning with the first ticket sold in 1992, the Texas Lottery has generated \$29 billion in revenue for the state and distributed \$61 billion in prizes to lottery players.
