Preoccupation with gambling and ways to get money to gamble.
Gambles with increasing money to get the same feeling of excitement.
Feels restless or irritable when trying to stop or control gambling.
Has tried unsuccessfully to stop or control gambling 3 or more times.
Gambles to escape personal problems or uncomfortable feelings.
Returns to gambling to win back gambling losses.
Lies to others about gambling frequency or losses.
Has written a bad check or stolen money to pay for gambling.
Gambling has caused problems in relationships or at work or school.
Has borrowed money to finance gambling debt or activity.
